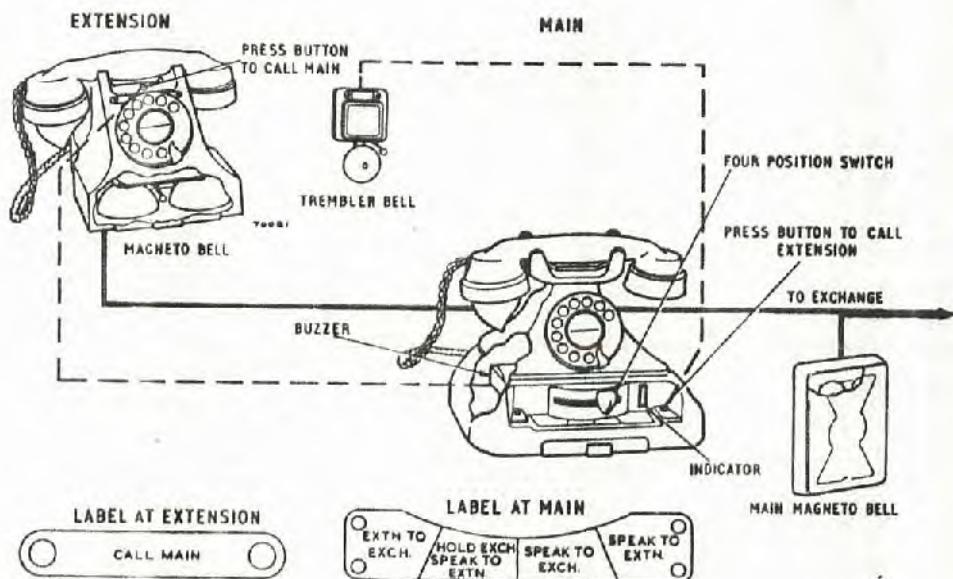


PLANS 7 AND 7A
*(Obsolescent)

Plans 7 and 7A consist of a main telephone with a switching key and one extension (internal or external) with intercommunication.

Incoming calls are received normally at the main telephone and can be extended to the extension.

The main can hold an exchange call and speak to the extension. The conversation between the main and extension is secret from the exchange call.

The main can call and speak to the extension and the extension can call and speak to the main at any time.

The extension can be connected directly to the exchange by the main. An indicator at the main shows when an extension is using the line except in CBS2 and 3 exchange areas where this is not possible for technical reasons.

The extension may receive incoming calls direct when desired (eg, for night service).

On plan 7, extension to exchange calls are not secret from the main. On plan 7A, extension to exchange calls are secret from the main.

On both plans, exchange calls on the main telephone cannot be heard at the extension.

Only 200-type telephones can be used on the main but either 300- or 700-type telephones may be used on the extension.

Plans 7 and 7A are now obsolescent and are superseded for new work by plans 107 and 107A. It should be noted however that on plans 107 and 107A it is not possible for an external extension to call the main whilst holding an external line call.
