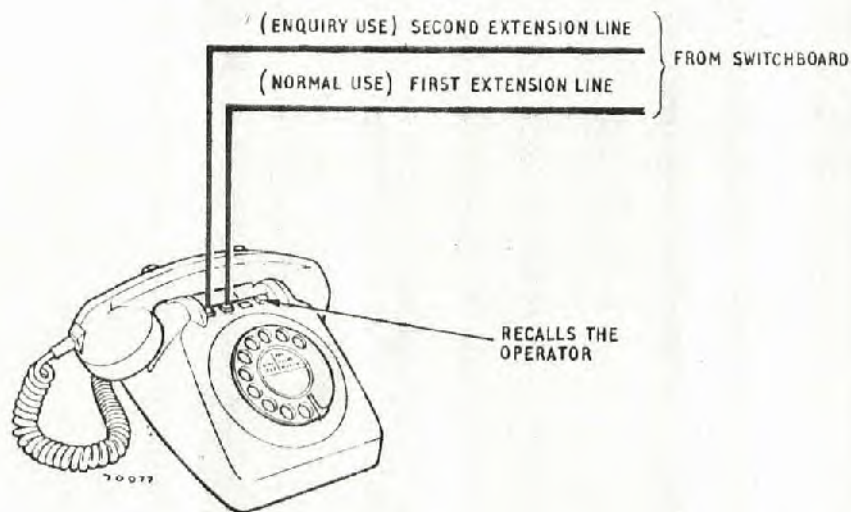


## PLAN 9

\*(Obsolescent)



Plan 9 consists of two PMBX extensions (internal or external) terminated on a press button telephone.

The first extension can be used for incoming and outgoing calls. The second extension can be used only for outgoing calls (there is no bell to signal an incoming call, though a bell set used to be provided on some 200/300 type installations).

The press buttons enable the user to hold an incoming or outgoing call on the first extension, make an enquiry (secret from the first extension) on the second extension, and then resume conversation on the first extension.

Plan 9 on PABX 3 and 4 is technically prohibited; on PABX 1 and 2 the local Engineering Division should be consulted.

Plan 9 has either a 300- or 700-type telephone.

\* There is no replacing plan arrangement.

The facilities provided by a Plan 9 configuration are currently available to all PABX extension users and many PMBXs incorporate operator recall facilities. Where necessary the customer should be offered an additional PMBX extension.
